The Obligations of Church Membership

I was doing some reading this week and came across the following address by C.F.W. Walther (the first president of the LCMS). In it, Walther instructs new members as they are received at his congregation. I didn't have a good definition of being a *member* of a congregation, and I find this helpful in describing how living as a Christian connects to living as a member of Mount Calvary.

By signing our constitution, you have taken on a twofold obligation: the general obligation of a Christian and the special obligation of a voting member of our congregation.

The general obligations of a Christian you embraced already when you were baptized and confirmed, and by signing our constitution you have merely repeated the promises previously made. Those promises consist in this, that as Lutheran Christians you will believe and confess the truth and lead a godly life.

The new obligations that you have acquired are these:

- That you will not absent yourselves from public worship, neither on Sunday nor on any festival day nor on a weekday, unless compelled to do so;
- That you will attend every voters' meeting unless prevented by circumstances beyond your control;
- That you will at all times be concerned about the welfare of the congregation and nurture it in every way possible. That you will:
 - ° Give us the benefit of your advice.
 - ° Always vote for what you consider right.
 - Contribute according to your means toward the support of church and school and of the poor in our midst.
 - ° When voting for new pastors, teachers, elders, or other officers of the congregation, let your vote be prompted only by your concern for the congregation's welfare.
 - Oladly submit to admonition from the Word of God; when you see others sin, practice brotherly admonition instead of talking about them behind their backs; and when a case of church discipline comes up for discussion, proceed strictly according to the Word of God.
 - Submit to the rules and regulations made by our congregation, see to it that others observe them, and do all that is in your power to promote harmony.
 - ° In case doctrinal controversies should occur (which we ask God graciously to prevent), judge strictly according to the Word of God and the Lutheran Confessions.
- That you will pray often for the congregation.
- That you will patiently bear with the weak in our midst.
- That you will join no other religious organization, especially not a secret order; that you will not send your children to the nonreligious public schools nor have your life insured in companies that practice extortion.
- Finally, that you will faithfully remain one of us unto death or until the Lord may lead you elsewhere.

If you succeed with the grace of God in carrying out these promises, your membership will prove a blessing to others, but, above all, you yourselves will enjoy the fruits of our vineyard. May God graciously grant it! Amen.

More Than a Negative

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without technically lying. You tell just enough of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing how close we can get to sinning without technically going over the line.

But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when He gave us the commandments. He's not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. We shouldn't just avoid murdering people — we should be of service to our neighbor.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our relationship with him:

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers and your friends is one of the most precious gifts you have been given. You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

But speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved child of God for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.
